J.K. Rowling: WB p. 32 / 1

1 Rowling's parents met d) on a journey. (text: Her mother and father first met on a train that was travelling from London to Scotland.)

2 At school Rowling liked c) languages. (text: her favourite subjects at school were English, French and German.)

3 On the train in 1990 she a) thought of the Harry Potter story. (text: In 1990 she was travelling between Manchester and London when she had the idea of writing the Harry Potter books. The train was four hours late)

4 In Portugal she b) wrote more of her book. (text: Later, Rowling moved to Portugal [...] free to write her book during the day.)

5 Back in Britain, she c) had a difficult time. (text: Rowling and her child moved back to Britain [...] Rowling had no job, very little money, and her marriage was over.)

6 She has c) three children. (text: Rowling and her child moved back to Britain [...] she and her husband Neil had a son in 2003 and a daughter in 2005.)

Titanic: TB p. 144/145

1 In the early 1900s people crossed the Atlantic by ship. It took about a week. The Titanic was the first bigger and more comfortable steamer. Today people travel to the USA from Europe by plane. The journey takes between six and nine hours.

2 The diagram shows the dimensions of the Titanic. You can see that it was about as big as three planes of the type Airbus A380 and a lot bigger than a car or a bus. It was exactly 269 metres long, 28 metres wide and 53 metres high. It had 2,435 passengers.

3 example:

In 1912 the Titanic started its journey from England to New York with about 2,000 people on board. The captain ignored warnings about icebergs. So, on 14 April the ship hit an iceberg and got holes. Later people realized that the ship would sink and tried to get into a lifeboat to survive. There weren't enough lifeboats for all passengers. 1,500 people were killed when the ship finally sank.

4 The red part of the ship was for third-class passengers. They were in the stern and the bow. The lifeboats were at the top of the ship. The first-class passenger who were in the hull were closer to the lifeboats. The third-class passengers in the bow died first because the water started coming in there. 75 per cent of the passengers in third-class died.
